

Infineum Children's Privacy Notice

Infineum has a duty to ensure children and young people ("you") that attend our sites are looked after and protected from harm. It's our job to tell you and your parents, *or legal guardian*, how we collect information about you and what we do with it.

What we do with your information

When you visit our site, we may take your Personal Information, such as your name, address, email address, date of birth, phone number and that of your parents. We, may also take your photograph, but only if you or your parents let us! Sometimes Infineum has to give your information to other people, but only when you say it's ok or when the law says that we have to. When your information is given to someone else, they must look after it and keep it safe, just like we do.

We may need your information for:

- getting in touch with you and your parents when we need to
- health and safety if something happened to you, like if you fell down and hurt yourself
- complying with the law regarding data sharing

How long do we keep your information

We don't keep it forever (promise!), only for as long as we need it to help us do the thing we needed it for. We have a policy that tells us when to keep it and when to bin it.

What are your rights?

You and your parents have the right to:

- Be told how we use your information
- Ask to see the information we hold



- Ask us to change information you think is wrong
- Ask us to remove information when it's not needed anymore
- Ask us to only use your information in certain ways
- Tell us you don't want your information to be processed
